**Club Xyloh loses license for 30 days and must become a 21-and-over license when reinstated**

**- Club Hilltop is placed on probation for a year and fined a total of \$5,700 for 15 violations -**

**HONOLULU (Feb. 13, 2009)** – The Honolulu Liquor Commission (HLC) took the following action at its 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the fiscal year on Feb. 12, 2009.

- **Club Hilltop** (no contest) was fined a total of \$3,000 for three violations of Rule 3-84-78.042 (fondling), a total of \$1,500 for five violations of Rule 3-84-78.01(b)(employee consumed liquor while on duty on the licensed premises), fined a total of \$500 for five violations of Rule 3-84-78.01(c) (employee solicited or accepted food or beverage as a gift from or at the expense of a customer while on duty at the licensed premises), and fined a total of \$700 for two violations of Rule 3-82-38.5(a)(non-registered employee). In addition, the Commission placed the licensee on probation for one year, ordered the enforcement section to provide quarterly compliance reports to the Commission and requested the owner to be present for the first quarterly report.
- The Commission entered a default judgment against **Café Xyloh**, suspended the license for 30 days, and then limited the license to 21-and-over following the completion of the suspension. In addition, the licensee was ordered to present business and security plans to the Commission two weeks prior to the end of the license suspension. The matters being adjudicated included two violations of Section 281-78(b)(5), HRS (licensee knowingly permitted a person who was disorderly, or under the influence of liquor, to be or remain in or on the licensed premises), violation of Rule 3-82-38.5(a)(non-registered employee), and three violations of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor).
- **Yakiniku Seoul** (no contest) and **Kikuya Japanese Restaurant** (no contest) each were fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor).
- **Zippy's** (no contest) was fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor). The Commission suspended \$250 of the fine provided the licensee receives no similar violation within one year.

During the public hearings portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **New Valley Store, Inc.** for the transfer of the business and Retail General license of **Palolo Valley Store, Inc.** at 2144 Kauhana St. and for a change of trade name to **New Valley Store, Inc.**
- Approved the application from **Costco Wholesale Corporation** (dba **Costco Wholesale #1038**) for a Retail General license at 4589 Kapolei Parkway.

During the preliminary hearings, license applications and requests portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **Tiana Karaoke LLC** for a Dispenser Beer and Wine license (Cat. No. 3 – Live entertainment or Recorded Music and Dancing) at 60 North Nimitz Hwy., Unit A.
- Approved the application from **Koa Bar LLC** for a Dispenser General license (Cat. No. 3 – Live entertainment or Recorded Music and Dancing) at 2410 Koa Ave., Unit No. 5 (**Hale Waikiki**).
- Approved the request from **Taylor Investment, Inc.** (dba **Stadium Food Pantry**) to permanently delete an area of its licensed premises at 4510 Salt Lake Blvd.

During the other business portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Ratified the Administrative Actions Report for January 2009.
- Heard a weekly report on administrative matters from the Liquor Administrator.
