**Commission fines Bionic Chevron, Waianae Market and Posh Enterprise
for selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor**

HONOLULU (March 23, 2009) – The Honolulu Liquor Commission (HLC) took the following action at its 34th meeting of the fiscal year on March 19, 2009.

- **Bionic Chevron** (no contest) was fined \$2,000 for a repeat violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor). The Commission suspended \$1,000 of the fine provided the licensee receive no similar violation within one year.
- **Waianae Market** (no contest) was fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor). Provided the licensee can confirm with a police report within 10 calendar days that there was a robbery incident just prior to the sale involved, the Commission would suspend \$250 of the fine provided the licensee receive no similar violation within one year.
- **Posh Enterprise** (no contest) was fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor). The Commission suspended \$250 of the fine provided the licensee receive no similar violation within one year.
- The adjudication against **Cirque Hawaii** for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor) was continued to the next available setting.
- The adjudication against **Mall Café** for violation of Rule 3-84-72.1 (failing to keep its premises in a clean and sanitary condition, to wit, bottles of liquor contained small dead insects) was continued to April 16, 2009.
- The adjudications against **Silk Lady Lounge** for three violations of Rule 3-84-78.042 (fondling), three violations of Rule 3-84-78.01 (licensee's employee consumption of liquor while on duty on the licensed premises), three violations of Rule 3-84-78.01(c) (licensee's employee solicited or accepted food or beverage as a gift from or at the expense of a customer while on duty on the licensed premises) and four violations of Rule 3-82-38.4(b) (time card) was continued to April 23, 2009.

During the public hearing portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **SouthSeas Wings Discovery Bay, LLC** (dba **Buffalo Wild Wings Grill & Bar**) for a Restaurant General license (Cat. No. 2 – Live entertainment, Recorded Music and Dancing) at 1778 Ala Moana Blvd., Suite UL-10 (**Discovery Bay Center**).

During the license application and requests portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **E&O Honolulu, LLC** for a Special General license on March 27, April 16 and April 24, 2009 at 900 South Beretania St. (**Honolulu Academy of Arts**). In a related matter, the Commission approved the request from **E&O Honolulu LLC** (4562 Aukai Ave.) for a waiver of the requirements to submit Personal Histories and Affidavits, fingerprint cards, and Criminal History Record Clearances for its members for its Special General license application at 900 South Beretania St. (**Honolulu Academy of Arts**).
- Denied the request from **Shigezo Hawaii, Inc.** (dba **808 Kapahulu**) for reconsideration of Commission finding of default and imposition of \$1,000 penalty on Dec. 30, 2008.

During the other business portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Reviewed the three-month probationary period of **Chong Chang, Inc.** (dba **Café Lulu Rara**) and terminated probation for the licensee.
- Reviewed the six-month probationary period for **The O Lounge** and decided to continue the probation, suspension, age restriction (21 and over) and required that special events be approved by HLC enforcement before the event.
- Heard a weekly report on administrative matters from the Liquor Administrator.
- Conferred in executive session with the HLC Administrator regarding personnel and employment matters, in accordance with HRS 92-5(a)(2).
