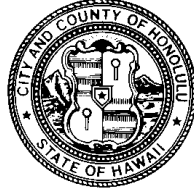

**Commission fines Dave & Buster's for failing to suppress
an altercation between a patron and security personnel**

- C & G Mini Mart also fined for selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor -

HONOLULU (May 1, 2009) – The Honolulu Liquor Commission (HLC) took the following action at its 39th meeting of the fiscal year on April 30, 2009.

- **Dave & Buster's** (no contest) was fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(6), HRS (failing to immediately prevent and/or suppress violent, quarrelsome, disorderly, lewd immoral or unlawful conduct of any person on the licensed premises, to wit, one or more of Licensee's security personnel was involved in and/or allowed a physical confrontation with a customer).
- **C & G Mini Mart** (no contest) was fined \$1,000 for violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(A), HRS (selling, serving or furnishing liquor to a minor).
- The adjudications against **Mall Café** for two violations of Rule 3-84-72.1 (licensee failed to keep its premises in a clean and sanitary condition, to wit, bottles of liquor contained small dead insects), one violation of Rule 3-84-78.52 (stacking), one violation of Section 281-78(b)(1)(B), HRS (licensee sold, served, furnished or allowed the consumption of liquor by a person who was at the time under the influence of liquor), and violation of Rule 3-82-38.4(b)(time card) were continued until June 4, 2009. The Commission also continued until June 4, 2009, the Notice of Petition and Hearing for nonrenewal of Dispenser General License No. E1407 issued to Saiming Corporation (dba Mall Café) at 80 South Pauahi St.

During the public hearings portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **Village Roadshow Theme Parks USA Inc.** for the transfer of the business and Dispenser General license (Cat. No. 3 – Live entertainment or Recorded Music and Dancing) of **The Waters of Kapolei, L.L.C.** (dba **Hawaiian Waters Adventure Park**) at 400 Farrington Hwy.

- Approved the application from **Hard Rock Café International (STP), Inc.** (dba **Hard Rock Café**) for a Restaurant General license (Cat. No. 2 – Live entertainment or Recorded Music and Dancing) at 280 Beach Walk. The Commission also requested HLC licensing staff to conduct a noise impact evaluation after construction is completed.

During the license and request portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved the application from **J Food & Beverage, LLC** (dba **The Restaurant at the Alana/J Bistro Martini & Wine/J Restaurant**) for renewal of its Temporary Hotel General license at 1956 Ala Moana Blvd.
- Approved the application from **Basic Food Group LLC** (dba **Town**) for a Caterer license to cater off the licensed premises to **Honolulu Academy of Arts** at 900 South Beretania St. on May 29, June 26, July 31, Aug. 28, Sept. 25 and Oct. 30, 2009. The Commission also noted that the applicant cannot have live entertainment without a license category change or a request for entertainment on a trial basis.
- Approved the request from **1128 Building, LLC** (dba **L G W**) to change the event date on their Special License Appl. No. 1553 from Nov. 6, 2009 to May 5, 2009 at 1128 Nuuanu Ave., Suite 103 (**Hawaii Institute of Hair Design**).

During the other business portion of the meeting, the Commission:

- Approved a request from **Lily Koi Restaurant and Lounge LLC** to waive requirements to submit a Personal History and Affidavit, fingerprint card, and Request for Criminal History Record Clearance for **Dennis Kinoshita**. The Commission is requiring the licensee to update the personal history and certify that he is not a convicted felon. The Commission also granted a waiver of the fingerprint card if the cabaret application is submitted before June 4, 2009. In addition, the licensee had requested zoning clearance for its application for a liquor license and the Commission found that a new zoning clearance was required.
- Heard a weekly report on administrative matters from the Liquor Administrator.
- Met in Executive Session to confer with counsel regarding personnel and employment matters, in accordance with HRS 92-5(a)(2).
