Re: 2009 Hawaii State Association of Counties Conference

The 2009 Hawaii State Association of Counties (HSAC) Conference provided attendees with a wonderful opportunity to discuss similar concerns and issues with our sister counties.

Conference sessions dealing with alternative sources of energy, the economic stimulus package, home rule initiatives, and public-private partnerships were very informational. We especially enjoyed meeting with business leaders from the U.S. Mainland to discuss universal health care via one-stop retail health care outlets. We have similar services available in Hawaii via community health center services; however, one-stop retail health care outlets will build and expand upon already-existing services. We will encourage local community health centers in our district to apply for private grants, and work with them directly in considering the community development block grant process. We were also briefed extensively by the respective Visitors Bureaus of Oahu and Kauai in regards to efforts by both counties to attract and bring in revenues from an increase in visitors. In addition to being a place of leisure travel,

all of our counties must do more to develop and expand Hawaii's potential as a venue for business travel. The City and County of Honolulu has a unique opportunity to build upon our relationship with the state towards marketing the Hawaii Convention Center and Waikiki. In addition to the conference itself, we also received the opportunity to meet with councilmembers and administration officials of other counties to share ideas and discuss economic concerns facing our entire sister HSAC counties. One of us being a newly elected county official and the other an experienced legislator at both the state and county levels of government, we jointly were able to bring both a fresh perspective and the knowledge of a well-rounded legislative veteran to discussions with our counterparts. We were able to touch upon topics such as suggestions on bed and breakfasts and real property tax classifications and collection with our fellow colleagues, and we look forward to building on our knowledge through furthering these discussions at the earliest opportunity. We invited our counterparts to join us in Honolulu to continue the dialogue started at the HSAC conference, and we will reconnect with them in the coming weeks.
