Bills recently passed by City Council

Bill 12, CD2

Relating to the Legislative Budget for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Bill passed third reading by a vote of 9 to 0.

Bill 13, CD2, FD1

Relating to the Executive Operating Budget and Program for Fiscal Year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Bill passed third reading by a vote of 9 to 0.

Bill 14, CD2, FD1

Relating to the Executive Capital Budget and Program for the Fiscal Year from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Bill passed third reading by a vote of 9 to 0.

Resolution 15-64

Determining the Real Property Tax Rates for the City and County of Honolulu for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Bill passed third reading by a vote of 9 to 0.

Bill 40

Relating to the Waipio Peninsula Soccer Park Fund (Creating a Waipio Peninsula Soccer Park Fund. Bill passed third reading by a vote of 9 to 0.

Bill 41, CD1

Relating to valuation of solar energy and solar water heating improvements for real property tax purposes. (Specifying that the value of solar powered energy improvements are not assessed for real property taxation purposes.)

Bill 66 (2014), CD1

Relating to public works infrastructure requirements including fees and services. [Amending Article 16 ("Violations , Penalties, and Liabilities for Grading, Grubbing, and Stockpiling') of Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990, as amended, Chapter 14.]

The following Bills have passed second reading:

Bill 8

Relating to public parks. (Addressing commercial activities at certain city beach parks.)

Bill 31

Relating to the real property taxation of agricultural lands. (Amending the dedication of lands for agricultural use.)

Kamehameha Day Holiday Schedule

- Honolulu - City and County of Honolulu government offices will be closed Thursday, June 11, in observance of Kamehameha Day, a state holiday.
Emergency ambulance, fire, lifeguard, and police services will be available.

- Refuse will be collected, and transfer stations, convenience centers, H-POWER, and the Waimānalo Gulch Sanitary Land-fill will be open.
- Parks, municipal golf courses, botanical gardens, and the Honolulu Zoo will be open.
- The Neal S. Blaisdell Center box office will be closed.
- The People's Open Markets will not be held
- All Satellite City Halls and Driver's License offices will be closed.
- The following traffic and parking regulations will be in effect:

On-street parking will be free, except for the meters on Kalākaua Avenue along Queen Kapi'olani Park and metered parking lots. Traffic lanes will not be coned for contraflow.

Road Re-Paving Updates

Very frequently, we receive calls from our constituents inquiring about the status of a road re-paving project. Earlier this year the City setup an online database that provides a listing of both current and future road re-paving projects. As this list is maintained on a regular basis it is an excellent resource for anyone interested in road repaving projects anywhere on the island.
