FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR PRESERVATION, CULTURAL, AND RECREATIONAL LAND ACQUISITIONS ON OAHU

The Honolulu City Council's Clean Water and Natural Lands Commission will accept applications from June 1, 2016 through July 29, 2016 for land acquisitions to be funded through the Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund. Under City ordinance, moneys in the Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund can only be used to purchase or acquire real estate or any interest for land conservation that meet specific purposes.

The Commission will accept and review all applications received by the deadline and forward its recommendations to the City Council for possible inclusion in the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 budget.

"This is a great opportunity for those groups looking for financial help in the protection of watershed lands; preservation of forests, beaches, coastal areas, and agricultural lands; public outdoor recreation and education; preservation of sites of historical or cultural importance; protection of significant habitats or ecosystems; and acquisition of public access to public land and open space. I encourage all interested parties to apply, said Councilmember Ikaika Anderson.

In conducting its review, the Commission will also look at the degree of urgency of the proposed land acquisition, financial support received from other sources, and how well a proposed project correlates to the City's Fund priorities.

BILL TARGETING ILLEGAL DUMPING SIGNED INTO LAW

Mayor Caldwell recently signed Bill 24 that strengthens the enforcement of illegal bulky item dumping. This new law will for the first time, allow inspectors to fine the individual perpetrators who illegally dump bulky waste, not just nearby residents and managers. It also provides higher fines for individual perpetrators as those violators can now be fined up to \$2,500 for each violation.

In various neighborhoods of Oahu, illegal dumping has become a problem and hopefully, this bill will help to curb illegal dumping. Please put items out only during your regularly scheduled pickup times, or take them to any of the city's various convenience centers.
