


Honoring Glenn Kajiwara Upon Retirement

New State ID Card Available for Residents Unable to Apply in Person

Do you have a family member or loved one who needs a new State ID but can't leave their home? Just this month, guardians and custodians of incapacitated residents can now apply for that person's State of Hawaii Identification Card. Applicants would need to provide a physician's letter stating that they are incapacitated and unable to appear in person to be photographed, fingerprinted, and present the required documents.

Please note the new non-compliant State ID card is not Federally REAL ID compliant and cannot be used for federal purposes such as boarding commercial aircraft. The non-compliant State ID card can be used to access medication, banking information, and other services.

This new State ID card features a yellow border and does not have the REAL ID gold star emblem. The new State ID card can only be acquired at the Kapalama Driver Licensing Center at 928 Dillingham Boulevard. You can make an AlohaQ appointment for the initial step of presenting your loved one's documentation and fee at www.AlohaQ.org. You will then need to obtain the applicant's signature, fingerprints, and photo and then return to a special window at the Kapalama Driver Licensing Center.
