The fiscal year '17 CIP budget was introduced as Bill 15 (2016) on March 2, 2016 as required by the City Charter. The City Council will hold Budget Committee Briefings on this and other budget bills this month. Proposals for amendments will then be discussed at future Budget Committee and Full Council meetings. The City's budget must pass by June 15, 2016 and it will take effect on July 1, 2016.
