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**Honouliuli WWTP Outfall Condition Assessment**

HONOLULU – The City’s Department of Environmental Services (ENV) and Department of Design and Construction (DDC) are conducting a condition assessment of the Honouliuli Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) outfall pipe September 17, 19 and 21, 2014, from midnight to 6:00 a.m.

A private consultant engineering firm and its sub-consultant will perform the nighttime investigation and assessment. The work includes opening manholes located along Essex Road, within Barbers Point Golf Course, within the Hoakalei development in the grassed promenade between Waiinu and Waiaama streets, near Ka Makana Swim Club, and within the Hoakalei Country Club in order to conduct inspection activities. Lighting will be setup around the manholes and personnel will be accessing and inspecting the pipe through the manholes.

“While the Honouliuli sewer outfall is currently functioning as designed, we must periodically inspect and make repairs, if necessary, to ensure the sewer outfall functions for years to come,” ENV Director Lori Kahikina said.

The 84-inch (land portion) and 78-inch (ocean portion) outfall pipe, completed in February 1979, transports treated effluent from the WWTP to a depth of 200 feet and approximately 1.7 miles off shore to blend back into the environment. The plant services residents and businesses from Halawa to Makakilo, from Mililani to Barbers Point.

The city anticipates no disruptions to water, sewer and roadways while crews perform the work.

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
