### **DRAFT REGULAR MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 10, 2015 298 REGIMENT MFTU RTI AUDITORIUM**

**CALL TO ORDER** – Chair Wilson Kekoa Ho called the meeting to order at 7:39 p.m., **with a quorum of eight (8) members present**. Note – This 13-member Board requires seven (7) members to establish a quorum and to take official Board action. Chair Ho welcomed everyone to the August 2015 meeting of the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32.

**OPENING PULE** – Chair Ho noted that meetings begin with an opening prayer. Those not wishing to participate were allowed to remove themselves. Elder Michael gave the pule.

Chair Ho changed the order of the agenda.

### CITY/STATE MONTHLY REPORTS

**Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) Report** – Captain Norbert K. Pokini reported the following:

- **July 2015 Fire Statistics** – There were 0 structure, 2 wildland (brush), 1 rubbish, and 1 vehicle fires; 40 medical emergencies, 1 search/rescue, and 18 miscellaneous service calls. There were no major or unusual incidents.
- **Fire Safety Tips** – Hawaii is currently in its hurricane season, which runs from June 2015 through November 2015. The HFD encourages every family to take the necessary steps to ensure it is prepared. Prepare an evacuation plan, make a survival kit, and stay informed about hurricane disasters. **Honolulu Police Department (HPD) Report, District 4 covers from Waimanalo to Kahuku** – Lieutenant Darryl Kon reported the following:

- July 2015/June 2015 Crime Statistics – There were 4/5 motor vehicle thefts, 7/3 burglaries, 15/9 thefts, and 36/14 unauthorized entries into motor vehicles (UEMV).
- Safety Tips – Lieutenant Kon announced a new telephone app at – smart911.com, where the public can register medical information before an emergency.

At 7:49 p.m. Wallace Silberstein arrived at the meeting. Neighborhood Assistant Ho administered the Oath of Office; **nine (9) members present.**

Chair Ho restored the order of the agenda.

RECOGNITION: STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AND WAIMANALO CANOE CLUB – Chair Ho gave some introductory remarks and introduced the elected officials Senator Laura Thielen, Representative Chris Lee, and Councilmember Ikaika Anderson. Scotty Reis Moniz thanked the Waimanalo community for the support for the Waimanalo Canoe Club and introduced other members of the coaching staff. At the State Championships the boys' team, ages 12 and under, took third place overall. Head Coach Nolan Reis Moniz added that the boy's team placed second place overall in its division. Team captain, Isaac, introduced himself and the other team members introduced themselves. Councilmember Anderson presented certificates of recognition. Senator Thielen added that finishing is winning and that finishing and winning makes Waimanalo proud. Representative Lee added his congratulatory comments. Picture-taking followed. Team members and supporters were allowed to depart the meeting. A grandmother thanked everyone involved.

#### FILLING OF THREE (3) VACANCIES ON THE BOARD

One (1) in Subdistrict 2 (Core Homes) – Chair Ho mentioned that there were three (3) vacancies on the Board. Last month, there was a nomination for Subdistrict 2, but this month, there were no nominations.

One (1) in Subdistrict 6 (Beach Lots, except for makai side of Kalaniana'ole Highway) – There were no nominations.

One (1) in Subdistrict 11 (Hale Aupuni) – There were no nominations.

As there were no nominations, Chair Ho deferred this item to the next meeting. Last month, Buck had asked if the Board could change the subdistrict seats to At Large seats. Chair Ho mentioned that the process is handled at the Neighborhood Commission (NC) level.

#### ELECTED OFFICIALS

Mayor Kirk Caldwell's Representative – The *City News August 2015* was distributed and Melissa Miranda-Johnson reported the following:

- No Concerns from Last Month – There were no updates from last month about the Makai Camping Company.
- Title VI Program Report Public Hearing – The Department of Transportation Services Public Transit Division (DTS-PTD) will be holding a public hearing on Tuesday, September 1, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at the Mission Memorial meeting room. As a recipient of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds, DTS-PTD is required to comply with FTA requirements that prohibit discrimination in all programs, activities, and services. City Councilmember J. Ikaika Anderson – Don Aweau distributed Councilmember Anderson's newsletter and Councilmember Anderson reported the following:

- Agricultural Dedication – The agricultural dedication form must be filed by Tuesday, September 1, 2015. For assistance in filling out the form, call the office at – 768-5003.
- Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) – The Council's Committee on Zoning and Planning is reviewing amendments for Bill 20 (2015), which was introduced by the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) and provides for new regulation of accessory dwelling units (ADU), while retaining the ohana dwelling provisions. Bill 20 (2015) would allow units to a maximum of 800 sq. ft., with a separate kitchen. The amendments were proposed by Councilmember Anderson.
- Bill 8, Relating to Commercial Activities Ban – Councilmember Anderson's Office is working on a mailer for Waimanalo residents to voice their concerns about allowed/not allowed commercial activities.

Comments followed: Agricultural Dedication Form – Alivado asked and Councilmember Anderson answered that the agricultural dedication form is now filed for five (5) years instead of annually.

Governor David Ige's Representative – Chair Ho mentioned that as there has been no Governor's representative since last year, this item will be deleted from the agenda next month.

Senator Laura Thielen – Senator Thielen distributed the newsletter and reported the following:

- Waimanalo Hawaii Hazards Awareness and Resilience Program (HHARP) – This month's newsletter is dedicated to Disaster Preparedness. The training schedule from August 2015 through December 2015 is listed in the newsletter.
- State Department of Transportation (HDOT) – The HDOT has been meeting and improvement projects, Phase I will include improvements from Olomana Golf Course to Waimanalo's Jack in the Box and will include sidewalks with bike lanes on the mauka side, widening of the shoulders, stripping to discourage speeding, and more time to cross at the crosswalk. Phase II/Phase III will have more of the same with sidewalks to the Waimanalo District Park and to the Kaena Boat Ramp. Maybe, there will be sidewalks to the Waimanalo School.

Comments followed:

1. Road Improvements – Alivado asked and Senator Thielen answered that bids will go out in three (3) months and HDOT is asking for a noise variance to work at nights. Alivado asked Senator Thielen answered that there may be a lapse in funding between phases and Representative Lee will be working with her on the funding.
2. Bicyclists – Uncle Joe Tassill wanted clarification about bicyclists using the sidewalks and riding on the back roads and Senator Thielen explained.

Representative Chris Lee – Representative Lee reported the following:

- Safety – The overall view is to have safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists through various methods.
- Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO) Sale – The Public Utilities Commission (PUC) will be holding public hearings on the NextEra proposed purchase of Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO). It was mentioned that solar energy is not promoted in Florida, the home of NextEra. Kaua'i went from a private company to a co-op. Maui/Big Island are looking into it. Representative Lee supports a publicly-owned utility, which could have State funding of a return of \$90 per shareholder.

Comments followed: Department of Hawaiian Homes Lands (DHHL) – Tassill added that the Hawaiian Homes Commission (HHC) is already addressing the issue.

At 8:18 p.m. Albinio departed the meeting; **eight (8) members present.**

At 8:21 p.m. Wallace Silberstein departed the meeting, **seven (7) members present.**

At 8:26 p.m. Albinio returned to the meeting; **eight (8) members present.**

APPROVAL OF JULY 13, 2015 INITIAL CONVENING MEETING MINUTES – **Laughlin moved and Buck seconded that the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32 approves the July 13, 2015 Initial Convening meeting minutes, as amended. The motion was ADOPTED by UNANIMOUS CONSENT, 8-0-0 (AYE: Albinio, Alivado, Buck, Galea'i, Ho, Keola, Laughlin, and Nakamura; NAY: None; ABSTAIN: None).** The amendment was as follows:

- Page 5, under Community Blood Drive, it should read, "Chair Ho noted that Kaehu Keawe, an Eagle Scout from Troop 45 in Waimanalo, is hosting a Blood Drive for those in need."

### RESIDENTS'/COMMUNITY CONCERNS

Private Airplane flying Above Waimanalo in Circles – Chair Ho mentioned that Pastor Riki reported that an aircraft was circling for two (2) hours over Waimanalo and its noise was disturbing the residents. There was no updates.

Comments followed:

1. Tassill added that there were helicopters flying overhead, too.
2. A resident noted four (4) to five (5) sight-seeing helicopters.
3. Kama-Toth added the colors of the helicopters and was concerned about the preservation of the natural resources from commercial activities. Senator Thielen noted that there may be military helicopters.
4. Tiffany Patrick mentioned that the aircraft were non-military aircraft. Marine Corps Base Hawaii (MCBH) has a website with a list of military aircraft traffic. Around Friday, July 31, 2015 there was a fly-over residential area. The case was investigated and corrections were made.
5. Kama-Toth was advised to call Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). If anyone could find a speaker, then Chair Ho will put the speaker on the next agenda.
6. Tassill was concerned about the accident two (2) months ago at Bellows Beach and the helicopter crash on Fort Street Mal a few years ago and Waimanalo residents' safety.

Ka Iwi Coastline Resolution – Chair Ho mentioned that last month the Board heard a presentation and that he would draft a resolution in support of the Ka Iwi Coalition, Livable Hawaii Kai Hui, and the Trust for Public Land. **Laughlin moved and Albinio seconded that the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32 supports the acquisition of the Ka Iwi Mauka lands in Maunaloa, Oahu. As there were no objections, the motion was ADOPTED by UNANIMOUS CONSENT, 8-0-0 (AYE: Albinio, Alivado, Buck, Galea'i, Ho, Keola, Laughlin, and Nakamura; NAY: None; ABSTAIN: None).** The resolution is at the end of the minutes.

Nakamura mentioned that representatives of Napua Aina O Waimanalo were present. Kauikuli Kalama clarified the process of purchasing the land and placing it in conservation forever. Napua Aina O Waimanalo will be hosting a fundraiser and asked everyone to purchase tickets and/or for any donations to help raise funds. Another member of the five (5) families, Kalei gave her vision for the future if the purchase fails and thanked the Neighborhood Board for its support for the preservation of the Ka Iwi Coastline for future generations to enjoy the natural resources. Kama-Toth added her concern for the future and welcomed any kokua with ticket sales and any donations. Chair Ho thanked the women for their efforts.

Food Service Set-up with Tables and Chairs – Andy Jamila was not present, but Chair Ho reported that Jamila had spotted a food service truck and there were about 40 chairs with tables. Chair Ho went back a few days later and could not locate the truck. Chair Ho added that phone caller reported that the truck was at Waimanalo Beach Park (WBP) two (2) nights ago on Saturday, April 8, 2015, and was advertising for weddings. Chair Ho commented that with the helicopters flying around, the community should be vigilant and find out what is happening.

Resolution to Honor Joe Lukela – Chair Ho did not get a reminder in time to place this item on the agenda and wanted to add the resolution to tonight's agenda. **Laughlin moved and Albinio seconded to add the resolution to honor Joe Lukela to tonight's agenda.** However, Chair Ho mentioned that there needed to be a two-thirds (2/3) vote of nine (9) to place this item on tonight's agenda and there were only eight (8) members present. Two (2) people Chris Kramer gave a brief background to the resolution about the honoree, who lived from 1879 to 1966 and read the resolution. Chair Ho noted that he will place the resolution on the next agenda for a vote. Tassill introduced Sandra and Denis Park of the Lukela Ohana, who came from Waialua on the North Shore. Ms. Park thanked the Board for consideration of the resolution and will return next month. Tassill added that the honoree, Joe Lukela was from the Waimanalo ahupua'a. Alivado asked and it was answered that the Hawaii Kai Neighborhood Board No. 1 had passed a resolution to honor Lukela.

### BOARD BUSINESS

Hawaii Bicycling League (HBL) – Brendon Hanna announced the 34th annual Honolulu Century Bike Ride on Sunday, September 27, 2015. Hanna noted that the HBL will follow the same route and try to minimize disruption to the community. The HBL is educating cyclists to respect the other users of the road. In preparation of the Century Ride, the HBL will be doing its annual Waimanalo Clean-Up of the back roads on Saturday, August 29, 2015,

starting at 8:30 a.m. Hanna added that any group that wants to do a fundraiser on Sunday, September 27, 2015, may call him at 371-3469.

Walk, Bike, Drive (Free Safety Presentations) – The HBL also gives free presentations, which include the following topics: How Drivers Can Prevent Crashes, The Vulnerable Users, Where Cyclists Should Ride, How to Avoid Crashes With Pedestrians, and How Pedestrians Can Stay Safe. The presentations are 15-45 minutes, tailored to the audience, and funded by State Department of Transportation (HDOT).

Comments followed:

1. Resident Kalani Kalima mentioned that the roads are narrower, due to the grass overgrowth and that bikers are racing with two (2) or more abreast. No one stops at the intersections.
2. Chair Ho mentioned that the Special Duty Police officers were at the two locations at the highway and at Kumuhau Street and Hihimanu Street, but they were just talking. Hanna will follow up and Hanna noted that the HBL is educating cyclists to follow the rules of traffic and is encouraging the HPD to cite wayward cyclists.

**Alivado moved and Laughlin seconded that the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32 supports the Hawaii Bicycling League (HBL)'s 34th Annual Honolulu Century Bike Ride. As there were no objections, the motion was ADOPTED by UNANIMOUS CONSENT, 8-0-0 (AYE: Albinio, Alivado, Buck, Galea'i, Ho, Keola, Laughlin, and Nakamura; NAY: None; ABSTAIN: None).**

Chair Ho changed the order of the agenda.

#### RESIDENTS'/COMMUNITY CONCERNS (Continued)

Hiking/Horse Trails – Kalima reported heavy usage of a hiking/horse trail. A hiking trail (Maunawili) is getting over-used. Now, that it is hurricane season, Kalani Kalima was concerned about flood control and tree trimming along Flamingo Road.

Comments followed:

1. Alivado asked if all parties could bring their plans to the Neighborhood Board. Kalima noted that the Sierra Club is blazing trails. The area may be under the State Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR). Other organizations are involved and may need a permit. A bike club was racing.
2. Kama-Toth thanked Kalima for his awareness.

Waimanalo Police Substation – Andrew Jamila was not present and no report was available.

Dick Evans Bike Race – Chair Ho reported that the Dick Evans Bike Race will be held on Sunday, August 30, 2015

#### COMMUNITY REPORTS

#### MILITARY REPORTS

Hawaii National Guard (HNG) – Staff Sergeant Lemont reported the following:

- Training – A Warrior Leadership Course started on Friday, August 7, 2015 and graduation will be on Saturday, August 29, 2015. Recruit Sustaining Program training will be from Friday, September 11, 2015 to Sunday, September 13, 2015. Helicopter training will be on Wednesday, August 26, 2015 and on Saturday, September 12, 2015. The HNG is aware of the noise complaints and will have flight plans have the helicopter fly in and out of Bellows Beach and not over residential areas.

Marine Corps Base Hawaii (MCBH) – Tiffany Patrick reported the following:

- New Vehicle Requirements – Changes to the vehicle and base access policies were implemented for military and civilians, including visiting retirees, doing business at Marine Corps Base Hawaii. All vehicles on the installation must be clearly identified by an MCBH decal or paper pass.
- Sunset Flight Line (Five [5] Kilometer) 5K – The Sunset Flight Line 5K will be on Friday, September 18, 2015 at 5:30 p.m., at Hangar 102, MCBH. Online registration closes Monday, September 14, 2015. Registration details and information can be found on the MCCA website: <http://mccshawaii.com/races>. The public is invited.

- Volunteers Needed for the Kaneohe Bay Air Show and Open House – Volunteers will get a t-shirt and certificate of appreciation. The Kaneohe Bay Air Show and Open House will be on Saturday, October 17, 2015 and Sunday, October 18, 2015. Admission is free. Everyone is invited to see the Blue Angels.
- Clean Up – This past weekend, 25 Marines with 808 Clean Up turned in 136 pounds of debris.

Comments followed: New Policies – Chair Ho asked how the new policies affect the public for the upcoming events. Patrick answered that for the Sunset Flight Line 5K, passes will be in the registration packet. For the Air Show, no decals will be needed, as military and volunteer personnel will be directing traffic to parking areas.

Bellows Air Force Station (BAFS) – Major Dawn Standridge and Craig Gorsuch, Environmental Program Manager, reported the following:

- Intern Program – The program ended in July 2015 and anyone interested in the nursery for native plants, call Gorsuch at 927-1867 (C).
- Sand Dune Restoration Project – The last sand dune restoration project "Hopu One Kea" was on Saturday, July 25, 2015 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. One hundred volunteers, many from local church groups, restored 3,000 sq. ft. with native plants. The next project will be on Saturday, September 26, 2015.

- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Classes – The next classes for 50 people will be at St. George's Church on Thursday, September 17, 2015, Thursday, September 24, 2015, and Saturday, September 26, 2015. Call Keola at 216-4107 or Call Frencha Kalilimoku at 259-7222.

#### **Resolution to Support the Acquisition of the Ka Iwi Mauka Lands in Maunaloa, Oahu**

WHEREAS Maunaloa was recognized as an ili of the ahupuaa of Waimanalo and originally belonged to the Koolaupoko district on the island of Oahu before being moved by the Hawaiian Legislature to the Kona District in 1859.

WHEREAS the Maunaloa and Waimanalo communities were historically joined by Kealaikapapa pathway and today are joined by Kalaniana'ole Highway.

WHEREAS for over 40 years the communities of Waimanalo, Maunaloa, and our statewide community, have worked together to keep the Ka Iwi coastline, located in Maunaloa, in its wild, natural state and free from development.

WHEREAS the community groups Ka Iwi Coalition, Livable Hawaii Kai Hui, and the Trust for Public Land are working with the City and County of Honolulu (C&C), the State of Hawaii, and our island communities, to purchase 182 acres of the Ka Iwi Mauka lands to keep them undeveloped and in their natural state for our community today and for future generations.

WHEREAS numerous undocumented Hawaiian cultural sites have been revealed on the Ka Iwi Mauka lands and need to be documented, protected and preserved for study of our kupuna and our Hawaiian culture in Maunaloa.

WHEREAS the makai lands of Ka Iwi at Awawamalu (Alan Davis) have been preserved, the mauka lands need to be preserved to support the whole area as a Total Cultural Property.

WHEREAS the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32 supports the efforts of the Ka Iwi Coalition, the Livable Hawaii Kai Hui, and the Trust for Public Land for the purchase of these lands.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Waimanalo Neighborhood Board No. 32 continues to support the acquisition efforts for the Ka Iwi Mauka lands by our community and community groups.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution will be sent to the Mayor Kirk Caldwell of the City and County of Honolulu and members of the Honolulu City Council, who are partners in this historic land protection effort.
