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DRAFT REGULAR MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, JANUARY 10, 2013 ALA WAI CLUBHOUSE

CALL TO ORDER: Chair Linda Wong called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. **with a quorum of 12 members present.** (Note - This 15-member Board requires eight (8) members to establish quorum and to take official Board action.) Chair Wong explained that the 18-page mailout included tonight's agenda and corrections to the May, June, July, August and September 2012 minutes. Along the right side of the agenda, Chair Wong listed the suggested time limits for the agenda items. Chair Wong totaled two hours and 26 minutes for the two-hour meeting.

PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS

Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) - Captain Bryan Goo reported the following:

- **December 2012 Statistics** - There were a total of 199 calls; 9 fire calls, 130 medical/rescue emergencies, 5 hazardous conditions, 8 service calls, 41 good intent calls and 6 false alarms. There were no unusual incidents.
- **Fire Safety Tips** - Always supervise children when they are using a microwave oven. Use only microwave-safe food containers or dishes; never use aluminum foil or metal. If your microwave oven catches fire, keep the door closed, turn it off, and unplug it from the wall receptacle. If the fire does not extinguish, go outside and call 911. Purchase a microwave oven that has an independent testing laboratory label. Complete and return the product registration card to the manufacturer so they can inform you of recalls.

Comments followed:

1. **Used Fire Extinguishers** - Chair Wong asked how to dispose of or recharge spent fire extinguishers. It may be cheaper to buy a new one. HFD will follow up.
2. **Automatic External Defibrillators (AED)** - There were questions on the rules concerning AEDs and how to use an AED. Instructions for use are included on the devices.

Honolulu Police Department (HPD) District 6, Waikiki (Beat 662) - Lieutenant James Strickland reported the following:

- **December/November 2012 Statistics** - There were 2/1 robberies, 2/4 burglaries, 13/16 thefts, 3/4 assaults, 3/0 motor vehicle thefts, 2/4 criminal property damage, 1/0 liquor law violation 10/18 motor vehicle collision (MVC), 20/24 arguments/family-non-families and 10/8 unauthorized entry into a motor vehicle (UEMV). There were a total of 646/373 cases for Beat 662.

Comments followed:

1. Statistics - Board member Waialeale requested the statistics for the 10 categories for the last five (5) years total. Lieutenant Strickland will follow up.
2. Cars on Sidewalks - A resident was concerned about cars illegally parked on sidewalks. It is a violation. The resident was advised to call 911.
3. "Bad Elements" in the Parks - A mother reported that she doesn't want to take her children to the park, because of the homeless people there and because some people are drinking. HPD responded that they are allowed to be in the park up to the 10:00 p.m. closing. If there is criminal activity (drinking), call 911.

Honolulu Police Department (HPD), District 7 - Lieutenant Allan Nagata distributed the written report, which highlighted the following:

Comments followed:

1. Drive Safely - Lieutenant Nagata reminded everyone to drive safely in rainy weather.
2. Change Oil and Windshield Wipers - Lieutenant Nagata recommended changing the motor oil at the recommended intervals and to be aware of other parts as needed.
3. Statistics - Board member Waialeale requested the statistics for the last five (5) years total. Lieutenant Nagata will take the request back. For more statistics, visit - www.hpd.org.

Board of Water Supply (BWS) - Ellen Kitamura, a Deputy at the BWS, introduced herself and she was available to hear concerns. Justin Kessler had submitted a written report for January 2013 to Chair Wong. (See attached report at the end of the minutes.)

Comments followed: Billing - Board member Narita mentioned that two meetings ago, a resident reported that they left for a trip and when they returned the billing had gone up. Kitamura will follow up.

FILLING OF VACANCY IN SUBDISTRICT 1 - Board member Miller reported that Lee Manfredi was/is on the mainland, receiving medical treatments. Manfredi received a "three-absences letter" from the Neighborhood Commission Office and she felt "pressured" to resign from the Board, so she did. However, Manfredi would like to remain on the Board. **Allen nominated Lee Manfredi to fill the vacancy in Subdistrict 1. (No second required.)** **The Diamond Head/Kapahulu/St. Louis Heights Neighborhood Board No. 5 APPOINTED Lee Manfred to fill the vacancy in Subdistrict 1, 11-0-1 (AYE: Allen, Cain, Mathieu, Miller, Naho'opi'i, Narita, Persons, St. Denis, Takenaka, West and Wong; NAY: None; ABSTAIN: Waialeale).** The Oath of Office will be administered to Manfredi upon her return to Honolulu.

RESIDENTS'/COMMUNITY CONCERNS

1. No Parking for the Honolulu Marathon - There is no designated parking area for when special events, like the Honolulu Marathon, is run. Resident cannot exit his residence along Diamond Head Road and he wanted a designated parking area to park at, the night before the events.
2. Request for More Trash Receptacles at the Access Points to the Beach Parks and Request for More Frequent Pick Up of Trash at the Beach Parks - The resident made this request for Leahi Beach Park and Makalei Beach Park.
3. Request for Diamond Head Bikeway Update - Bicycle riding is dangerous around Diamond Head with bicyclists, runners and motor vehicles.
4. Sidewalks between the Two Beach Parks - The residents are concerned about the makai sidewalk between Leahi Beach Park and Makalei Beach Park and, as they are the property owners, their liability for the maintenance of the sidewalk.
5. Unruly Behavior by the Homeless - It is increasing in Kapi'olani Park during daytime hours. Some residents avoid taking their children or pets to the park due to the unruly behavior by the homeless. The resident wanted clarity on park rules and to know what to do about it.
6. Sidewalks - Micah Munekata reported that Councilmember Chang's Office is working with many City departments on the sidewalk and homeless issues. Call HPD if there are any incidents. Chair Wong mentioned that Councilmember Chang's Office was addressing other issues on Makalei Place. Chair Wong requested that Munekata give Councilmember Chang's report later in the agenda. The resident reported the lack of sidewalks in Kapahulu. Sidewalks are usually assessed to the adjoining property owner and the whole street has to agree to a sidewalk. Chair Wong requested that Councilmember Kobayashi's Office or Councilmember Chang's Office to work with the residents on this issue.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS

Governor Neil Abercrombie's Representative - Attorney General David Louie reported the following:

- The Passing of U.S. Senator Dan Inouye - U.S. Senator Dan Inouye has done many great things for Hawai'i and Governor Abercrombie honors his legacy. Due to the passing of U.S. Senator Dan Inouye, Governor Abercrombie has appointed Lieutenant Governor Brian Schatz to replace Senator Inouye in the U.S. Senate. State Senate President Shan Tsutsui succeeded to the Lieutenant Governor's Office. Then, Governor Abercrombie appointed State Representative Gil Keith-Agaran to the State Senate. Governor Abercrombie will appoint a State Representative from a list of three names.
- New Legislature - The Governor's Budget has been submitted to the Legislature, with the Council of Revenues' forecasts, which showed increases in revenues. Governor Abercrombie will give his "State of the State" address on January 22, 2013 and his continuing vision for the State. The Governor has released \$70 million for Capital Improvement Projects (Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) for transportation, \$18 million for the State Parks and \$1.7 million for the Film Studio at Diamond Head. Governor Abercrombie is moving forward on his "New Day" program.

Board member Miller and Chair Wong mentioned that Senator Les Ihara, Jr. couldn't attend tonight's meeting, as he was preparing for the opening of the Legislature.

As there were no objections, the agenda was taken out of order.

RESIDENTS'/COMMUNITY CONCERNS (Continued)

7. Voting Irregularities - Resident Keiko Bonk mentioned there is a lawsuit about the ballot shortages at Hokulani School, where many voters left and did not vote) and other irregularities (wrong ballots) at 22 other precincts. Also, the League of Women Voters put in a formal complaint to the State Elections Office.

8. Repeal of Act 55, Public Lands Development Corporation (PLDC) - Bonk is working on repealing Act 55 (2012), which created the PLDC. Senator Les Ihara, Jr., Senator Sam Slom and Representative Scott Saiki are working on repealing Act 55, also. Board Secretary Mathieu asked how interested parties may get involved, and it was stated that the best way was by contacting their elected officials.

State Senator Sam Slom - Board member Julie Allen, who works in Senator Slom's Office, distributed his business card, which was printed at non-taxpayers' expense, and his newsletter, which gave his Committee assignments, the State Senate Committee Hearing Schedule and Rule 16 Standing Committees, which described each committee. She mentioned that any concerns will be passed on to the Senator.

House Speaker Calvin Say - House Speaker Say reported the following:

- Council of Revenues - House Speaker Say distributed the report by the Council of Revenues that Governor's Representative Louie alluded to.
- Alencastre Street - The St. Louis Heights residents requested a white bin for recycling, but due to the steepness of the street, their request may not be accommodated.
- Peter Street - House Speaker Say and residents were concerned about parking on both sides of the street and TheBus has a hard time maneuvering there.
- House Speaker Emeritus - House Speaker Say mentioned that next week Wednesday his title will be "House Speaker Emeritus."

State Senator Les Ihara, Jr. - Senator Ihara reported the following:

- Legislative Session - The Session starts 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, January 16, 2013. Everyone is invited for lunch at 12:00 noon.
- State of State Address - The Governor's State of State Address will be on January 22, 2013.
- Repeal of the PLDC - Newly-elected Senate President Donna Kim will introduce the bill, which is supported by Senator Ihara and other groups.

State Representative Scott Nishimoto - Representative Nishimoto's Office staff member distributed his newsletter and reported the following:

- Free Tax Clinic - It will be on Saturday, January 26, 2013 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Hawai'i State Capitol, 3rd floor. Everyone is invited, but it will be on a "first come, first served" basis, so make an appointment early.

Matson arrived at 7:50 p.m.; **13 members present.**

State Representative Bertrand Kobayashi - Former State Senator and now Representative Kobayashi passed out a card with his State Capitol information and reported the following:

- Attendance at Neighborhood Board Meetings - Representative Kobayashi plans to attend the monthly meetings.
- Natorium - The Governor's budget has \$2 million for concept and design and exploration. The future of the Natatorium is still under discussion and concepts may include the "complete beach" option by itself and the "complete restoration of the pool" or volleyball court options would cost millions of dollars. The \$2 million is for exploration, not construction.
- Clark Hatch Exercise Station - There is a proposal for working with Clark Hatch physical fitness center to establish an exercise station.
- Elections - During the elections, there were many complaints about the district filed with the Elections Office, concerning location of polling places, access in one precinct, which stretched the entire width of the district.

Comments followed: Natorium - Subdistrict Chair Laura St. Denis asked if there would be opportunities for public input into the Natatorium issue. The community is very concerned about concept, the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), and construction. Representative Kobayashi mentioned that he has not been fully briefed as yet. Chair Wong requested that Representative Kobayashi write up his Natatorium notes for next month. Another option is moving the arches to another location. It is part of the exploration. The Natatorium is on two historic registries. As the discussion was nine minutes over the time limit, Chair Wong decided to move the meeting along and requested that interested parties could talk with Representative Kobayashi afterwards. Matson stated that she would file a complaint.

Mayor Kirk Caldwell's Representative - As Walea Constantinou was not present, Chair Wong read the following:

- Charles St. Application - The Planning Commission closed the public hearing on November 14, 2012, and voted to support the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP)'s recommendation to approve the rezoning of the property from R-3.5 Residential District to B-1 Neighborhood Business District, including conditions related to traffic, site plan, and other standard conditions. The Planning Commission's recommendation was forwarded to the City Council via the Mayor on December 3, 2012

City Councilmember Ann Kobayashi - Councilmember Kobayashi distributed her newsletter and reported the following:

- Natorium - This issue has been going on since 1980.
- Sidewalks - This is a difficult situation. When new sidewalks are put in, the adjoining property owners have to pay for them. The City has to get approval from the whole street.
- City Budget Committee - There are new members on the City Council and Councilmember Kobayashi is the Chair of the Budget Committee. There are six members on the Budget Committee.
- TheBus - The new Mayor Kirk Caldwell will restore bus service, though some of the changes were more efficient.
- Potholes - Mayor Caldwell pledged more money for repairing the streets.
- Crosswalks Signals - There are new flashing overhead lights on King Street. They may be in Kapahulu next.

Comments followed.

1. \$22 million Change Order for the Rail System - Board member Matson requested clarification on a Change Order. Councilmember Kobayashi thought that it was \$22 million, but she will check. Councilmember Kobayashi mentioned that there were other change orders, too.
2. Crosswalks Signals - The flashing overhead lights span six lanes on King Street, which is one way. They are pedestrian-activated. In Kapahulu, the City may look at the Kalihi model.
3. Crosswalk at Date Street and Kapahulu Avenue - Councilmember Kobayashi mentioned that Subdistrict 2 Chair Bertha Naho'opi'i has brought up this concern for several years.
4. Two More Written Concerns - Chair Wong gave Councilmember Kobayashi two community concerns for her or Councilmember Stanley Chang to follow up on.

City Councilmember Stanley Chang - Micah Munekata distributed Councilmember Chang's newsletter and reported the following:

- Smoking Ban at Public Parks and Beaches - Councilmember Chang's Bill 72 (2012) has passed second reading.
- Campbell Avenue - Councilmember Chang is working with HPD on the speeding issue on Campbell Avenue and the side streets. If anyone cannot contact HPD, District 7 right away, then call Councilmember Stanley Chang's office.
- Crosswalks - Councilmember Chang is working to install more crosswalks in Kapahulu and near Kapiolani Community College (KCC).

Comments followed:

1. Community Garden in Waikiki - Councilmember Chang has talked with Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) at Paki Park. There is nothing available, but Councilmember Chang will keep the discussion going. The waiting list has come down to 20. At Jefferson Elementary School, they talked with the Principal and they may have the land, but there is an issue about security. Board Secretary Mathieu suggested going to a School Community Council (SCC) meeting.
- Bike Lanes on Diamond Head Road - The City will probably use sharrows, markings on the road. Bike lanes could go where the streets are wider. Chair Wong suggested that Councilmember Chang's Office keep in touch with the resident.
- Scenic By-way Project for Diamond Head Road - Board member Matson mentioned that they would take these comments into consideration. There are other concerns that will affect the Kapahulu-side of Diamond Head.

PRESENTATION

Waikiki Regional Circulator Study - Wes Frysztacki, President Weslin Consulting Services, Inc. and Linda Frysztacki, and Glen Moir, Project Manager, made a PowerPoint presentation. By 2019, the rail station at the Ala

Moana Center will be the major station. However, before that happens, there are eight areas of concern. They propose to have direct bus service with only 15 bus stops. Their guiding policy is "Pedestrian First." They have identified five "gaps" in the network and they described bike sharing. The next step is implementation.

Comments followed: More Information - Board members wanted to know the budget for the project and about more public workshops. The bikes in Kailua belong to a private vendor, under the Department of Health (DOH).

APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 11, 2012 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES: Mathieu moved and Miller seconded to accept minutes of October 11, 2012 as submitted by Neighborhood Assistant. The motion was ADOPTED, 12-1-0 (AYE: Allen, Cain, Mathieu, Miller, Naho'opi'i, Narita, Persons, St. Denis, Takenaka, Waialeale, West and Wong NAY: Matson).

APPROVAL OF THE NOVEMBER 8, 2012 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES: Miller moved and Naho'opi'i seconded that the Diamond Head/Kapahulu/St. Louis Heights Neighborhood Board No. 5 APPROVE the November 8, 2012 regular meeting minutes, as submitted by the Neighborhood Assistant. The motion was NOT ADOPTED, 7-2-4 (AYE: Allen, Mathieu, Miller, Naho'opi'i, St. Denis, West and Wong; NAY: Matson and Narita; ABSTAIN: Cain, Persons, Takenaka and Waialeale). Eight (8) votes (quorum) are needed to take action. This item was deferred to the next meeting.

BOARD BUSINESS

Candidate Registration - Candidate Registration for the next term for the Neighborhood Boards will be from mid-December 2012 to February 15, 2013, and the election period would be from April 27, 2013 to May 15, 2013.

Oahu General Plan - The proposed recommendations by Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) and the Diamond Head/Kapahulu/St. Louis Heights Neighborhood Board No. 5, adopted November 17, 2011, were circulated. The Board took no action on Oahu General Plan 2035. Board member Cain requested that the General Plan be on the next agenda.

REPORTS

Chair's Report - Chair Wong reported the following:

1. If a Board member has a conflict of interest, they should declare it before their vote. This does not necessarily bar members from voting.
2. All members are to display proper order and decorum during Neighborhood Board meetings.
3. All able Board members are requested to help breakdown meeting tables and chairs.
4. All Board members are requested to bring hard copies of minute corrections to the meeting for Board members' comparison.

Treasurer's Report - Treasurer Miller reported that the last mailout was 18 pages and strongly recommended that the Board stop spending. The balance was \$946.68. The Treasurer's report was filed.

Subdistrict 1 - Subdistrict Chair Julia Allen reported on the St. Louis Heights area.

Subdistrict 2 - No report.

Subdistrict 3 - Subdistrict Chair Laura St. Denis submitted the following report:

The Waikiki Natatorium presentation is still pending. Information is still on hold. Some of the Lifeguards would like to remain in the current structure that has been rehabilitated. A Board member thought that the Ocean Safety office could be moved to Kewalo Basin.

There are homeless camped out on the old Cannon Club area. A home on Collins St. was broken into and items taken. Across the street a bicycle was taken.

better understand its route. This application is currently available on iPhone, and an Android version is forthcoming.

2. Honolulu 311 - Honolulu 311 is a real time mobile civic engagement platform. Honolulu 311 provides a free, simple, and intuitive platform empowering people to report broken streetlights, derelict or abandoned automobiles, stored property violations, and more via your smart phone. A picture tells a thousand words and Honolulu 311 makes it a snap. The application uses the Global Positioning System (GPS) in your smart phone to show the location of your report. Download it today it's free! This application is available for iPhone, Android and Blackberry.
3. Honolulu Tsunami Evacuation - In the event of an emergency, time is of the essence. - Elimination of the Minimum Payment option; and
- A new 10-digit account number will replace the previous 14-digit number.
