- I. **CALL TO ORDER:** Kaleo Gagne, Chair, Manoa Neighborhood Board No. 7
PLEASE NOTE: As this is a special combined meeting scheduled pursuant to Neighborhood Plan Sections 2-14-109(c) and 2-13-102, the regular business of the Manoa and McCully-Mo'ili'ili Neighborhood Boards is deferred to their next regular meetings (See Agenda item V below).
- II. **PRESENTATION - UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA:** Presenters will be Chancellor Henshaw and others. Below are topics & questions submitted by neighbors & board members. Further questions will be taken in Section III below.
- **Rail Terminus & Connectivity**
 - a) What is the position of the UH -Manoa, UH System and Board of Regents on this issue?
 - b) Do Regents prefer the terminus on the lower Manoa campus, near Stan Sheriff; or the upper campus near Sinclair Library?
 - c) How does the campus interlink with Mo'ili'ili to ensure a smooth flow of people into and out of the business community?
 - d) How will the rail be incorporated into the Long Range Development Plan for UH - Manoa?
 - e) Has UH - Manoa developed any plans for safe bicycle routes going from campus to Kapahulu and Waikiki? For example, a path along the Manoa stream?
 - f) Is UH - Manoa supporting safer bicycle routes to and from the campus?
 - g) Are the rules & regulations on campus, regarding bicycles, mopeds, etc hindering the free flow of transit between the campus and the Manoa and Mo'ili'ili neighborhoods?
 - **Makeover Team / Departmental Support for Community**

What schools, departments are helping in the community and where? Law offers Elder Law to the Public. Who and where are Education, Social Work, Arts & Sciences, Dental/Medical, Urban Planning, Engineering, Athletics, et al. assisting?
 - **Drainage Plan for UH - Manoa**
 - a) How does it protect the campus and the surrounding neighborhoods?



- b) Are copies of this plan available on-line or on paper?
- c) How does this plan tie in with the Corps of Engineers work on the streams in our ahupua'a?
 - o How is UH - Manoa working with the City, DLNR, state, etc to complete the bridge, and numerous other projects, from the 2004 flood, to ensure that the neighborhoods and the campus are safe from the next rainstorm?
- **Security for UH - Manoa**
 - a) Is there a list of crimes committed on campus available from 2009 and earlier? On line? What web site? On paper?
 - b) What orientation is given to incoming freshmen and dorm residents for their safety? What orientation is given to staff?
 - c) What powers do the campus police have? Can they arrest?
 - d) Who responds first, the Sheriff's Dept or HPD for an on-campus emergency? When is the public notified and by whom?
 - e) Is there a student court on campus? What powers does this court have?
 - f) Are staff and security trained in first aid? Who certifies this training?
- **Emergency Preparation for UH - Manoa**
 - a) How and under what conditions are e-mail blasts and message boards utilized?
 - b) How and under what conditions would the campus be locked down?
 - c) After the 2004 flood, UH - Manoa seemed confused in who reported the information, whom was in charge, etc. Has this Emergency Plan been updated and practiced since 2004?
- **APEC**
 - a) In mid-December the first meeting will be held on campus (East-West Center).
 - b) What traffic impacts will the neighborhoods see as this will impact our annual Santa Claus Parade in Mo'ili'iili and numerous sport events on campus for volleyball and basketball?
 - c) Will traffic routes be changed for APEC meetings? Will there be a higher police, secret service presence in Mo'ili'iili and Manoa?
 - d) What direct and indirect costs will UH - Manoa have to absorb due to this APEC conference?
- **UPass**
 - a) After the first year, this \$20/semester program was to be re-evaluated for expansion to community college students. Has/is this taking place as the cost to community college students is \$125/ semester now?
 - b) If such studies are underway/ about to begin, who is in charge and responsible? May the public and students comment? When will the study be completed?
- **Enrollment & Tuition**
 - a) What is the enrollment projection for 2010 and for the next 20 years?
 - b) What is the percentage of resident v. non-resident students for 2010 and for the next 20 years?
 - c) What is the percentage of graduate students v. baccalaureate students for 2010 and for the next 20 years?
 - d) Why are tuition costs yearly rising way above the yearly inflation rate?
- **PRU & LRDP (Plan Review Use and Long Range Development Plan)**
 - a) Are there still campus expansion plans? Which direction/neighborhood?
 - b) Is UH - Manoa still looking at a Special District Plan? Why was Mo'ili'iili included in the previous Special District Plan without any discussion in the neighborhood?
 - c) What plans does UH - Manoa have for 2777 Woodlawn Drive (old USDA building)?
 - d) What is the timeline & cost for completing the President's house?
 - e) Is there a schedule of maintenance, with cost estimates, for all the buildings on the Manoa campus?
 - f) With dorm space for 4,000 students are all the rooms occupied? Is there a waiting list?
 - g) Will future plans include dorms on campus, not just along Dole Street?
 - h) Are there plans for more faculty housing to attract new faculty? Timeline and location?

- **Sports**

- a) Although state funded, why is the pool not open to the public? Same question for the weight room, track, and basketball courts?
- b) When will recycling begin on the lower campus?
- c) Recruiting of coaches and student athletes seems to lack local talent. How is this being addressed in the near and long range?
