

# THE FUND

## What is the Purpose of the Fund?

The purpose of the Fund is to acquire real estate or any interest therein for land conservation within the City and County of Honolulu.

## How Much is Available in the Fund?

The Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund is supported by one-half of one percent of O'ahu's real property tax.


**Funding opportunities for projects could be \$10 million.**

## Who Can Apply?

Community organizations, nonprofits, and other interested parties are encouraged to apply for funding.

## When Can Organizations Apply?

Applications are accepted at any time, and remain active for 12 months after the application date.




- Public outdoor recreation and education, including access to beaches and mountains

- Protection of watershed lands to preserve water quality and water supply


## THE COMMISSION

The Clean Water and Natural Lands Advisory Commission was re-established in 2016. Volunteer commissioners are appointed by the Honolulu City Council and the Mayor. The Commission ranks and prioritizes applications for use of the Fund, and makes project recommendations to the City Council.



- Preservation of forests, beaches, coastal areas and agricultural lands.

- Acquisition of public access to public land and open space



- Preservation of historic or culturally important land areas and sites

Conservation of land in order to reduce erosion, floods, landslides and runoff

## THE APPLICATION PROCESS



Department of Budget and Fiscal Services (BFS) reviews applications and submits qualified applications to the Commission



The Commission makes recommendations to the City Council from the qualified applications submitted by BFS



The City Council affirms or rejects the recommendations of the Commission for funding



The Department of Land Management will negotiate the transaction that will result in real property interests added to City inventory
