# Sign-On in Support of the Protection of Waikalua Loko I'a

## About this petition

Hawaiian Islands Land Trust (HILT) and Pacific American Foundation (PAF), Waikalua Loko I'a's non-profit landowner and steward, have partnered to permanently protect the two fishponds of Waikalua at Kāne'ōhe Bay, with a perpetual conservation easement. A perpetual conservation easement is a voluntary and permanent legal agreement between a landowner and a land trust or government agency, limiting future land use, and is recorded on title. The perpetual conservation easement over Waikalua Loko I'a (Waikalua or Waikalua Fishponds Complex) will ensure protection of the fishponds in perpetuity. After 25 years of caring for Waikalua's fishponds, its caretaker PAF, was able to purchase the property in 2019. To complete the protection of these fishponds, the last step is securing a perpetual conservation easement.

HILT is currently in the stage of seeking public open space funds and humbly request your support of HILT's initiative in applying for funding from the City & County of Honolulu's Clean Water and Natural Lands Fund, as well as other conservation easement funding sources. The following are a few highlights of HILT's Waikalua Fishponds Complex project:

- The acquisition of this conservation easement provides a rare opportunity to permanently protect a threatened coastline and estuary, while simultaneously ensuring the restoration and stewardship work at Waikalua Loko I'a can continue. The restoration and stewardship of Waikalua Loko I'a by Pacific American Foundation, the Kāne'ōhe community, and volunteers and students from all over Hawai'i and beyond, directly improves the health of the two fishponds and the Kāne'ōhe Bay ecosystem.
- The conservation easement will prohibit subdivision and development of an ancient Hawaiian fishponds' complex in an urban area, ensuring the cultural integrity of Waikalua Loko I'a.
- The conservation easement safeguards Pacific American Foundation's current commitment to provide: access for community 'āina-based learning, managed access to Kāne'ōhe Bay, and for the continuance of cultural gathering and fishpond-related cultural practices to continue through the generations for Kāne'ōhe families.

HILT is a Hawai'i 501(c)(3) nonprofit land trust that protects and stewards the lands that sustain Hawai'i, and perpetuates Hawaiian values by connecting people to 'āina. Our current land protection priorities consist of Hawaiian cultural landscapes, coastlines, and lands that produce healthy food for Hawai'i's people. HILT has protected over 21,000 acres throughout Hawai'i, owns and stewards 7 preserves, holds 52 conservation easements restricting private lands, and connects thousands of people annually to wahi kūpuna or places of Hawai'i's ancestral past.

By signing this petition, you are sharing your support of Hawaiian Islands Land Trust and Pacific American Foundation's initiative to raise public funding for a conservation easement in order to ensure the fishponds of Waikalua are protected in perpetuity.

Their research in limu to me is astounding as many of our native limu are so hard to grow and find. Waikālua very well serves as an asset to not just our community of Kāne’ohe but Kō Hawai’i Pae ‘Āina as a whole.

I humbly ask that Waikālua Loko I’a be protected in perpetuity through a conservation easement. So they may continue their work, and the generations to come may continue to benefit from this amazing place.
