Stacking Rule 3-84-78.52

An individual customer may have up to 2 standard servings of drinks at one time.

Standard servings:

Distilled Liquor 16 oz.

Wine or Sake 6 oz.

Beer 22 oz.

If a alcoholic beverage is larger than the standard serving the customer shall have only 1 drink.



Know that we are not promoting the service of 2 drinks to an individual customer, the rule provides the maximum you can serve. If your establishment makes it a policy to serve only one drink at a time, that's even better!

Understand that the Stacking Rule was designed as one of several measures to prevent over-service of alcohol to an intoxicated person. Over-service takes priority over any other rule on service of liquor.

If you are uncertain about what constitutes stacking, and/or have something on your menu that may be considered stacking, please call or email our trainers for clarification.



What's required for obtaining a Liquor Card?

When obtaining your very first Liquor Card you must provide the following documents:

- 1) Valid Photo ID
- 2) Original Social Security Card or W-2
- 3) TB Clearance
- 4) Authorization Letter for Manager Positions
- 5) \$10 cash per card

Managers & Bartenders must attend Server-Training Class & pass the certification test at our office.

For existing customers who have had a Liquor Card previously, only a valid photo ID, authorization letter (for managers) and \$10 cash is required. Managers & Bartenders must re-take Server-Training class if it has been 4 years or more since last attending.

Maintain accurate records! Liquor Commission Auditors may require you to produce your books and records within 3 calendar days of an audit request. [Click here](#) to access Rules.
