

SUBJECT: Public Infrastructure Map Revision for Primary Urban Center
Relocated Central Fire Station, 2020/PIM-1

This is to notify you that the City's Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) requests a revision to the Primary Urban Center (PUC) Public Infrastructure Map (PIM). PIM revisions are processed by the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) and acted upon by the Honolulu City Council. Your comments are important in the evaluation of the proposed revision. Submit written comments with reference number 2020/PIM-1 by August 31, 2020. If you are unable to meet this date, we encourage you to submit your comments late so that we may forward them to the City Council for their consideration. Please send to:

The PIM identifies major public projects with potential significant physical impact on the surrounding community. PIM symbols represent different types of infrastructure, and depict general location. The proposed revision adds a Fire Station (FS) symbol for the Downtown area. The site has not yet been determined. The FS symbol will allow for funds to be expended for the planning, engineering, and construction of relocating the Central Fire Station. Attached is a summary description with general location map of the proposal.

The proposed Fire Station will be located in the Downtown, Chinatown area. The new Fire Station will be multi-story, and include up to five fire apparatuses, crew quarters, battalion chief's headquarters, classrooms, and supporting administrative and training facilities. HFD finds that the current Central Fire Station, located on South Beretania and Fort Street, cannot be renovated or rebuilt to safely accommodate additional fire apparatuses that are critically necessary to maintain the health and safety needs of an increasing population in the nearby areas of Downtown, Chinatown, Vineyard, Iwilei, and Lower Liliha.
