Hawaii 'Hotels For Heroes' Makes Changes As Demand Increases

A Hawaii program providing free hotel rooms to health workers responding to the coronavirus has been modified after the demand exceeded the number of available rooms.

More than 870 room nights have been reserved through the Hotels for Heroes program, The Honolulu Star-Advertiser reported (<https://www.staradvertiser.com/2020/04/14/hawaii-news/hotel-for-heroes-tweaks-program-as-demand-grows/>) Tuesday.

The overwhelming demand forced organizers to make changes including limiting workers to seven-day reservations.

"There's been incredible demand and interest for these rooms," said Hilton Raethel, president and CEO of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii.

Hotels for Heroes was established to use extra hotel rooms while helping financially support the visitor industry and the community.

Hotels on Kauai, Maui, Hawaii island and Oahu with approved reservations are compensated \$85 per room per per night from state tourism funds. The program was developed by the Hawaii Tourism Authority, the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau and the Hawaii Lodging & Tourism Association.

The program does not accept health workers who have tested positive for COVID-19 or who have been required to quarantine.

For most people, the coronavirus causes mild or moderate symptoms, such as fever and cough that clear up in two to three weeks. For some, especially older adults and people with existing health problems, it can cause more severe illness, including pneumonia and death.

Hotels have been generous with their space, but organizers had to set limits after the demand "outstripped supply," Raethel said.

"Different institutions have different needs," Raethel said. "We are incredibly appreciative to have this opportunity for workers to have some time to themselves. We recognize this is an incredibly challenging time for the hotel industry."

Honolulu Fire Department Battalion Chief Kevin Mokulehua said the program will help about 1,000 active department workers.

"We've been receiving a lot of interest in the program and have seen a steady increase since it started," Mokulehua said.

The program should help reduce the number of first responders who have been staying in tents to isolate themselves from their families, he said.

Department members practice good hygiene and social distancing, but “there’s always this thing in your mind that I’m going home and I want to keep the family safe,” Mokulehua said.

Hotel for Heroes tweaks program as demand grows

Demand for the Hotel for Heroes program, which houses working health care employees and first responders in free hotel rooms, was so great in its first week that it outstripped supply.

Program organizers made some modifications, including limiting workers to seven-day reservations, and the program is back on track with more than 870 room nights already reserved. Facilities, which were allotted rooms based on their size, also were asked to voluntarily give back rooms that they didn't need.

Hilton Raethel, president and CEO of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, said, "There's been incredible demand and interest for these rooms. While the hotels were very generous, the demand that came in initially outstripped supply. We've put guidance in place, and we've put a limit in place on how many nights each person can access rooms."

Raethel said Kaiser workers were given access to rooms after a skilled-nursing agency on another island gave up some of its allotted rooms.

"Different institutions have different needs. We were fortunate to be able to give Kaiser an additional allocation because some rooms were given up," Raethel said. "We are incredibly appreciative to have this opportunity for workers to have some time to themselves. We recognize this is an incredibly challenging time for the hotel industry."

Many Hawaii hotels have temporarily closed. It was a sign of the times that the state's largest property, the Hilton Hawaiian Village Waikiki Beach Resort, temporarily suspended operations Monday.

Developed by the Hawaii Tourism Authority, the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau and the Hawaii Lodging & Tourism Association, the Hotel for Heroes program is a way to make use of the extra rooms while giving back to the visitor industry and the community.

Program hotels on Kauai, Maui, Hawaii island and Oahu with approved reservations are compensated \$85 a night from state tourism funds.

The program doesn't take anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or has to quarantine. It also doesn't allow anyone to tag along on the reservation, which is for working professionals who need assistance. New partnerships with Domino's and Enterprise also have provided some participants with an opportunity to get free pizza and rental cars.

"These rooms are not for vacation. They are for working people who need to decompress and socially isolate themselves from their family situation," Raethel said. "When they are in the rooms, they are required to self-isolate. There are not there to enjoy amenities or hang out at the gym."

Raethel said the program also provides a chance to get more sleep for those with long commutes or those working lengthy shifts.

Honolulu Fire Department Battalion Chief Kevin Mokulehua said the program will be a boon to the department's 1,000 or so active workers.

"We've been receiving a lot of interest in the program and have seen a steady increase since it started," Mokulehua said. "Our firefighters are working hard responding to hundreds of calls a day in partnership with EMS. We're responding to many emergency incidents to fires, rescues, hazardous materials and medical incidents, which are about 60% of our calls annually and especially with COVID-19 have increased."

Mokulehua said HFD is practicing good hygiene and social distancing, but even so, "there's always this thing in your mind that I'm going home and I want to keep the family safe."

The program should help to reduce the number of HFD first responders who are setting up tents to isolate from their families, he said.

“Oahu FLAG” aims to feed front line workers while patronizing local restaurants

In the midst of the coronavirus outbreak, a Kaimuki woman found a way to show appreciation to those on the front lines, while supporting local restaurants struggling from Oahu's stay-at-home order.

Dzikowski learned about a group called [Flag](#) – the front line appreciation group.

“It’s people helping people. Which is exactly what Hawaii is! We help each other. We’re on an island, we have to help each other. What I loved about the concept of FLAG – it’s feeding the front liners. Hospital, EMS workers, fire, transit workers, grocery store workers. People that have to go to work,” she explained.

The grassroots effort began in New Jersey. Multiple FLAG groups have since cropped up in cities across the mainland. Dzikowski started a group on Oahu.

“We just love up on our neighbors, aunties, uncles, friends by feeding them! To me, this was the perfect fit for Hawaii.”

With a small team of volunteers, [Oahu FLAG](#) solicits donations through social media and apps like Venmo. One hundred percent of the proceeds goes towards feeding local healthcare workers and first response workers, while patronizing local restaurants.

“It’s not just one restaurant. We’re looking to patronize local restaurants. Let’s face it, they’re hurting so badly right now. With their cut hours, with people not able to dine in. Those types of places are so important they stay in business after COVID-19. Those places can’t disappear,” said Dzikowski.

Since its inception, Oahu FLAG raised about \$5,000 through donations. The group recently purchased 100 bento boxes from Fort Street Café. The meals were dropped off to The Queens Medical Center.

“Not many people can afford to feed an entire group of hospital workers. But 5, 10, 20 dollars, they can afford. That’s more than enough. If everybody did that, we could feed the front line for a really long time.”

As long as the outbreak continues, Oahu FLAG vows to continue providing meals to the overworked.

“If you choose to focus on the good things, there’s so much good happening out there. There’s all sorts of groups trying to help in their own way, and that’s beautiful to me.”

Dzikowski says their next meal drop-off is slated for this weekend to Straub Hospital.

FAQS

How many times can I nominate someone?

You can nominate an individual once a week, each week of the promotion.

Can I nominate more than one individual?

Yes, you can nominate more than one individual. To do so, post a separate comment for each nomination and tag them on that week's Mahalo Meals post.

I would like to nominate someone, but they don't have an Instagram account.

Can they still be nominated?

No. Social media is a key component of the #KeepHawaiiCooking program, with the Mahalo Meals phase facilitated on Instagram. In order to participate, you and your nominee must have an Instagram account. Yes, you can nominate more than one individual. To do so, post a comment for each nomination.

How are the recipients of Mahalo Meals selected each week?

The #KeepHawaiiCooking team will review and select 10 nominees each week. The selected nominees must complete an online eligibility form and provide the details necessary to schedule their delivery of Mahalo Meals to their department.

Why are only hospital workers and first responders included?

The Mahalo Meals phase of #KeepHawaiiCooking is just one way to provide support to both local restaurants and Hawaii's caretakers. Our intent is to extend gratitude and kindness to these individuals who are working 24/7 on the frontlines to keep Hawaii safe and healthy.

How are restaurants selected to receive a Mahalo Meal grant?

The #KeepHawaiiCooking team will approach partner restaurants individually to fulfill meal orders and deliveries. The selected restaurants must complete an online eligibility form, agreeing to the program requirements before receiving a grant.

Are there restrictions on the hospitals and emergency response departments eligible for delivery?

Yes, there are limitations. At this time, we are considering the Acute Care Facilities listed on the Healthcare Association of Hawaii's website ([clk/http://hah.org/membership/hah-members/](http://hah.org/membership/hah-members/)), and police, fire and ambulance emergency response departments. The #KeepHawaiiCooking team will also work with partner restaurants to fulfill meal orders across the State as best as possible, but we are limited to the delivery radius of these restaurants.

How do I know this is not a scam?

If you are concerned, we ask you to visit our website at cpb.bank. You can find information there on #KeepHawaiiCooking powered by the CPB Foundation and also, information to contact Central Pacific Bank and the CPB Foundation directly.

The Keep Hawaii Cooking Story

On Friday, March 27, 2020, Central Pacific Bank and the Central Pacific Bank Foundation launched the #KeepHawaiiCooking initiative with the goal of supporting local restaurants, their employees and the community during this time of economic hardship caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

The CPB Foundation committed to reimbursing 50 percent of the cost of takeout or delivery meals purchased from participating local restaurants up to \$100,000 total.

All told, the first two phases of #KeepHawaiiCooking resulted in at least 10,400 meals shared, which translated into \$615,000 to local restaurants. Local diners were reimbursed almost \$310,000 from the CPB Foundation.

But #KeepHawaiiCooking was never meant to be just another flash in the pan (pun intended.) Selected nominees and their teams will receive up to 30 free Mahalo Meals in gratitude for their life-saving work.

ACTS OF KINDNESS

Many in Hawaii's food industry, although facing tough times themselves, are supporting the needy, health care workers and first responders:

>> **Sun Noodle** marked National Ramen Day on April 4 by sending 100 ramen kits to health care workers at Kaiser Permanente Hawaii, each kit containing two servings of fresh noodles and soup bases. The company also made ramen deliveries in Los Angeles and New Jersey, other cities where it has factories.

>> **Teddy's Bigger Burgers** donated 100 meals to Queen's Medical Center April 10

in a show of appreciation for those caring for COVID-19 patients. Teddy's is considering expanding the donation program to include other hospitals and first responders.

>> **Big Island Candies** has been shipping care packages of sweets to hospitals and police and fire stations, beginning in Hilo, where the company is based, and continuing statewide and to some mainland destinations. In a partnership with UPS, the packages have been delivered free.

"We know how difficult their jobs are and we want to be able to support them with a hot meal, to ease the burden just a little bit either during their shifts or when their shifts are over," co-owner Javier Barberi said.


