

Fire Drills Save Lives!

Figure out a way that everyone in the family can sound a fire alarm (yell, pound on the walls, use a whistle, etc.) Remember, a fire can prevent you from reaching other rooms. Be sure you always have an emergency escape exit (usually a window). Use the grid space at the left to draw your own escape route. (Look at the sample sketch to help you.) Make sure that everyone can open the windows and screens easily and then have a special outside meeting place to ensure that everyone is out, and safe!

For the older folks, and very small children, find a special way to help them get out, like having an outside ladder handy to use. Don't waste time getting dressed or gathering valuables. . . in a fire every second counts and the important thing is to get out safely.

Conduct regular fire drills, and you and your family can be safe from fires.



 9. Oil and gas drips from car
 10. Flammable liquids in glass container
 11. Paint and oily rags in trash can without lid
 12. Wrong size fuse
 13. Combustible (trash) near heating appliance
 14. Wood shingles (conflagration hazard)
