AUDIT REPORT WINS NATIONAL RECOGNITION

LEXINGTON, KY -- The 2013 Bronze Knighton Award for best performance audit in the medium audit shop category has been awarded to the City and County of Honolulu's Office of City Auditor by the Association of Local Government Auditors (ALGA). The Award will be formally presented at ALGA's Annual Conference in Tampa, FL, on May 5, 2014.

The report, *Audit of the Real Property Assessment Division*, was judged on several key elements, such as the potential for significant impact, the persuasiveness of the conclusions, the focus on improving government efficiency and effectiveness, and its clarity, conciseness and innovation.

The audit is a thorough and well-documented examination of an issue—property tax assessment – that affects a broad swath of the public. In particular, the audit used *effect* consistently to clarify for the readers why the findings mattered to policymakers and citizens.

The report also effectively used formatting, including headers, signposting, and exhibits, to help readers move through significant detail and comprehend findings of high importance.

Each year, local government audit organizations from around the U.S. and Canada submit their best performance audit reports for judging. The purpose of the competition is to improve government services by encouraging and increasing levels of excellence among local government auditors. Judges from peer organizations determined that this audit was among the best of 2013.

The Association of Local Government Auditors is a national audit association founded in 1985 committed to supporting and improving local government auditing through advocacy, collaboration, education, and training, while upholding and promoting the highest standards of professional ethics.
